Al-Walaa' and Al-Baraa'

(Affection for the Believers and Aversion with the Disbelievers)

All praise is due to Allāh, and may Allāh's peace and blessings be on His Messenger, his household, Companions and all those who followed him in obedience until the Day of Resurrection.

Al-Walaa' wal-Baraa', or Al-Muwaalah wal-Mu'aadah, have become among the abandoned subjects in Islam for many Muslims in the present time, because they think that this aspect is not a part of the Islamic Creed and acts of worship. Hence, they place their love, affection, aid and obedience with the disbelievers and defend them using their tongues and hands, while refraining from offering their Walaa' to the believers. Consequently, we wrote this short article about this important subject, asking Allah to benefit with it those who are unaware of the significance of the creed of Walaa' and Baraa' in Islam.

The Meaning of Walaa' and Baraa'

Yuwaalee and Walaa' are derived from the word Muwaalah, which means to love. Therefore, when you love someone, you will have offered him your Walaa', meaning you bring him close to your heart. Also, Wilaayah is the opposite of 'Adaawah (enmity), while Tawallee is one of the strongest types of Walaa', and it refers to obedience and following. Allāh said,

"His power is only over those who Yatawallawnahu [obey and follow him (Satan)], and those who join partners with Him (Allāh) [i.e. those who are Mushrikoon (polytheists)]." (16:100)

Also, Tawallee sometimes means to give

aid and support. Allāh said,

"It is only as regards those who fought against you on account of religion, and have driven you out of your homes, and helped to drive you out, that Allāh forbids you to Tawallahum (support or befriend them). And whosoever Yatawalla-ahum (supports them), then such are the Thaalimoon (wrongdoers those who disobey Allāh)." (60:9)

The word Mu'aadah comes from the words 'Adaa, 'Aada, 'Yu'aadee and 'Adaawah, meaning enmity, disfavor and feelings in the heart to harm and take revenge. Therefore, the 'Adu (enemy) is the opposite of Sadeeq (friend).

Walaa' and Baraa' (or Mu'aadah) in Islamic Terminology

From the meanings we gave for the words Walaa' and Baraa', we conclude that the origin of Walaa' means to love, while the origin of Baraa' (or Mu'aadah) refers to hatred. These two feelings result in a host of actions and feelings in the heart and on the part of the senses, entailing giving aid, support, compassion, help, Jihaad and Hijrah (migration), or the opposite of these meanings in the case of Baraa'.

Muslims are required by Allāh to offer their full *Walaa*' to the believers and their full *Baraa*' from the disbelievers.

The Status of the Creed of Walaa' and Baraa' in Islam

The creed of *Walaa*' and *Baraa*' has a high status in Islam, as is evident in the following points.

- 1. The creed of *Walaa*' and *Baraa*' is a part of the implications of testifying that there is no deity of worship except Allāh and that Muhammad is the Messenger of Allāh, which implies *Baraa*' from everything and everyone being worshipped except Allāh.
- 2. The creed of *Walaa*' and *Baraa*' is the strongest tie of *Eemaan* (Faith). The Prophet said,

﴿ أَوْثَقُ عُرَى الْإِيمَانِ الْمُوَالَاةُ فِي اللهِ، وَالْمُعَادَاةُ فِي اللهِ، وَالْحُبُّ فِي اللهِ وَالْبُغْضُ فِي اللهِ»

"The strongest tie of Faith consists of Walaa' for Allāh, Mu'aadah for
